




Caterina Penna: Director of Alumni


ACCESS TO BCC BIOSCIENCE IMAGE LIBRARY GROWS


In 2019, Berkshire Community College Professor of Life Sciences Fayette Reynolds created the Bioscience Image Library. The website got under 1,000 hits in 2019. Just three years later the digital library has gotten more than 3.3 million hits and is still growing as it gains attention worldwide. The Bioscience Image Library offers the general public free access to more than 1,200 microscopic images of plants, animals, bacteria, fungi and more. All images are within the public domain, meaning they can be used, reused, adapted or modified for any purpose and without restriction. As open educational resources, they are free of copyright and fees, allowing anyone with access to a computer the ability to download and share them. Reynolds also plans to add macro images of reptiles, amphibians, birds and mammals.

BERKSHIRE SCIENCE COMMONS OPENS AS CROSSROADS FOR STEM ON CAMPUS

The newly created Berkshire Science Commons (BSC) at BCC is a welcoming community science outreach space that offers opportunities to share and collaborate, build and create, learn and teach, and understand and wonder. The BSC unites traditional functions of makerspaces, science museums, discovery labs, seminar explorations, and science cafés; the combination realizes a vision beyond the individual components. It addresses community needs for citizen scientists, entrepreneurs, a skilled workforce and improved school access to advanced tools, technology, and machinery. Finally, the BSC embraces a more systematic approach to promoting equal access to, and equal success in, science and technology.

NEW ADVANCED MANUFACTURING TECHNICIAN CERTIFICATE PREPS STUDENTS FOR HIGH-DEMAND FIELD

The new Advanced Manufacturing Technician (AMT) Certificate program encompasses the fundamentals of electricity and manufacturing in order to educate well-rounded professionals for the manufacturing industry. The program is designed to help students gain faster entry into manufacturing jobs, while preparing them to continue their education by working towards an associate degree in mechatronics (a multidisciplinary field that combines electronics and mechanical technologies). Upon completing the certificate, which represents the first half of the mechatronics degree, students may either immediately enter the workforce with an entry-level job or go on to earn a mechatronics degree and secure a mid-level job.

Unlike traditional engineering programs, which often center on differential calculus-based concepts, the BCC program is tailored to students who thrive in a hands-on learning environment. The program specifically addresses the severe shortage, locally and nationally, of technician-level professionals and the increasing need for well-rounded technicians who can quickly adapt to changes in modern technology.

TECHNICAL THEATRE PROGRAM PREPARES STUDENTS FOR ARTS ECONOMY

The Technical Theatre Certificate is designed to prepare students for a wide range of careers in educational, community, and resident theatre venues, as well as the film industry. The program introduces students to the fundamentals of technical theatre and immerses them in applied hands-on learning. Through foundational courses, students build an understanding of theatre history, design, technical theatre, and practical uses of current industry standards. The certificate prepares students to enter the work force in the areas of stage management, audio, costuming, hair and makeup, lighting, set construction and scenic artistry. This certificate can also serve as the first step towards associates and bachelor's degrees.



STUDENT & CAMPUS SUPPORT

MYBCC WELLNESS PROGRAM LAUNCHED TO SUPPORT STUDENT MENTAL HEALTH

In 2022 BCC launched a new program, MyBCC Wellness, to help provide free access to mental health resources for all students. A complement to the BCC Personal Counseling Program, MyBCC Wellness provides students with access to:

- A 24/7/365 mental health support line for in-the-moment support from counselors and connections to community caregivers.
- Free telehealth or off-campus face-to-face counseling sessions. These sessions are available to students no matter where they are located, and no insurance is necessary.
- The Wellness Hub, which includes articles and videos on mental health and wellness topics such as mental and emotional health, fitness and nutrition, academic performance, stress management, healthy relationships and more.

NEW MULTICULTURAL AFFAIRS, DIVERSITY, AND ENGAGEMENT CENTER ON CAMPUS

As part of a campus-wide commitment to support historically marginalized students, BCC created the Multicultural Affairs, Diversity and Engagement (MADE) Center, which will be housed in the Susan B. Anthony Building. The MADE Center is designed for members of the BCC community to learn about, explore, and challenge notions of diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging.

SUPPORT STUDENT FOOD NEEDS WITH A GIFT TO THE CAMPUS CUPBOARD

The Campus Cupboard is a resource for any BCC community member who requires short-term assistance meeting their food needs. In a recent survey of students, 41% of respondents reported experiencing food insecurity. The Cupboard provides non-perishable food items, snacks, toiletries, household products, and more. Additionally, a new partnership with the Berkshire Community Diaper Project will provide diapers for students who may need help obtaining them for their children.



BCC COMMENCEMENT RETURNS TO TANGLEWOOD

BCC held its 62nd Commencement Ceremony on Friday, June 3, 2022 at Tanglewood. The first to be held in person since 2019, the ceremony honored graduates of the classes of 2020, 2021 and 2022. The College awarded 186 associate degrees and 92 certificates to 246 students in 41 programs of study. Twenty-four students received more than one degree or certificate. Graduates ranged in age from 18 to 74, with an average age of 32. While many graduates reside in Massachusetts, others hail from Connecticut, Florida, Michigan, New York and Vermont.
